Speaking of our 4-legged friends, we have a contract with Klugh Animal Control Services to pick up stray dogs. The Township gets charged each time they get dispatched to pick up a dog. Often, the caller also sees a tag on the dog and calls the pet owner, then Klugh either comes to the location, or cancels the call once they learn the dog has been picked up by the owner. The Township is still charged for the call. To keep costs down, I am asking if you catch a loose dog (safely) and notice a name tag to please call the owner first. If you cannot locate the owner, go ahead and call Klugh's. Your help with this issue helps everyone in the Township and keeps our costs down.

As for costs, the Township passed the Budget for 2023. The Township has held the line on taxes this year, even with the rise in inflation. The staff at the Township is very cost conscience and tries their utmost best to keep expenses down. There is no Tax increase this year. As well, for sewer customers, there is no increase in sewage treatment fees this year.

Here is hoping and wishing for a wonderful spring and summer, and if you get the chance and have not been, take a walk on our trail at Little Creek Community Park, play a round of golf, pickleball or basketball.

The Recorder of Deeds Office has been receiving a growing number of calls concerning deed and record safety.

As of October 1st, our office has implemented a "Records Notification Service" for all homeowners in York County.

The service is designed to provide security and assurance, no document is recorded without the homeowner's knowledge.

Sign up is "FREE" at the York County website, Recorder of Deeds, webpage. There will never be a charge to sign up.

You will need to provide a valid email address and your property ID number found on your county tax bill or look up on the website. Your email address and property ID number are protected and not shared with any other sources through this program.

The homeowner will be alerted by email, when a document is recorded with their Property ID Number attached.

This service can identify fraudulent activity that may have occurred without the homeowner's knowledge.

If you receive an alert, the program will guide you to another website to view the document. Should you choose to print from this website, there will be a small charge.

Please take advantage of this important safety service. It is easy to sign up and easy to unsubscribe at any time.

There is no risk to the homeowner by signing up, only the benefit of peace of mind.


Seven Ways to Be #StormwaterSmartPA

This issue of the Jackson Township Gazette will give you the Third and Fourth actions you can take to reduce stormwater runoff pollution at your residence and in your community. You'll find more specific guidance on residential property stormwater best management practices in "A Homeowner's Guide to Stormwater BMPs" located on our website www.jacksontwpyork.org under the "Quick Reference", "Stormwater Management" section.

The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection would like to know if you have come up with ways to be stormwater smart in Pennsylvania. If so, they would love to hear your thoughts and suggestions and see your stormwater management photos on social media. Share using the hashtag #StormwaterSmartPA, and help them spread the word to reduce stormwater pollution in Pennsylvania.

3. Set up a rain barrel at your residence

You can capture rainwater off your roof with a rain barrel, and then use the water in your garden or let it infiltrate slowly into the ground. There are various options from very simple to more involved.



4. Think about lawn care a little differently

Don't overwater your lawn. Consider using a soaker hose instead of a sprinkler. Use pesticides and fertilizers sparingly. Use organic mulch or safer pest control methods whenever possible. Don't leave grass clippings or leaves in the street or sweep them into storm drains. Compost them or use them for mulch. In the fall, mulch-mowing leaves back into the grass helps strengthen it and the soil, reducing stormwater runoff. Or just leave some leaves on the ground!

The May 2023 issue of the Jackson Township Gazette will continue with the Fifth and Sixth action to take to reduce stormwater runoff.
