TOWNSHIP MEETING HIGHLIGHTS:

- Rachel Gates of Gates & Gates resigned as the Zoning Hearing Board Solicitor.
- John Miller of MPL Law Firm was appointed as the Zoning Hearing Board Solicitor.
- Resident Ned Leppo was appointed to the Planning Commission Board replacing Robert Callahan. Ned's term will begin June 2023 through December 2025.
- The Board approved the sale of the 60-inch Tiger Bangle Brute Broom Mower which received a high bid of \$2,000.00. The mower was awarded to Bret Smith of Douglas Equipment.
- The Junkyard licenses were renewed for July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024 for the following locations: 329, 351 and 642 Jackson Square Road.
- A public hearing and meeting was held July 5, 2023 at the Township Building to consider a Zoning Map Amendment for parcel #33-000-HF-0101.00-00000 (18.96 Acres) from Rural Conservation (RC) to Industrial (I) owned by Martin's

Ordinance 230-2023 to amend the Zoning Map for Martin's Potato Chips parcel #33-000-HF-0101.00-00000 from Rural Conservation (RC) to Industrial (I) was enacted contingent upon the applicant executing and recording the declaration of restrictions provided by the applicant.

- The resignation of Diane King as a member of the Planning Commission Board was accepted with regret.
- Resident Kevin Lain was appointed to the Planning Commission Board for the remainder of Diane's term. Kevin's term will begin July 2023 through December 2026.

SUBDIVISION AND LAND DEVELOPMENT ACTIONS:

- York Airport Properties Final Land Development plan for an additional airport hanger located at 6054 Lincoln Highway West was granted waivers for a preliminary plan and plan scale and given conditional approval.
- Sunnyside Apartments (Zenith Construction) Preliminary/Final Land Development plan located along Sunnyside Road was granted a waiver for a preliminary plan submission, a planning sewer exemption and given conditional approval.

Smoke Alarms

EVERY HOME SHOULD HAVE AT LEAST ONE WORKING SMOKE ALARM.

They are inexpensive protection for your family that doubles the chances of survival.

SMOKE ALARM DO'S AND DON'T'S

- Replace all smoke alarm devices after 10 years.
- Install alarms on every level of your home, next to every sleeping area and inside every bedroom.
- Never "borrow" a smoke alarm battery for some other use.
- Make sure everyone knows the sound of an alarm.
- Plan your escape route and agree on a meeting place outside.
- Test alarms monthly; keep them free of dust and replace the battery at least once each year.

SMOKE ALARM ACTION PLAN

- Seconds count, plan and practice your escape before a fire occurs. Drill twice yearly with the whole family.
- Know two ways out of every room.
- When the alarm sounds, get out fast! Call the fire department from a neighbor's house.
- Once out, stay out!

Topic: Accessibility and Affordability of Public Transit

You don't have to live in a crowded city to access the convenience of public transportation. In fact, public transit is closer to home than you may think. rabbittransit offers multiple forms of transportation in Jackson Township, including fixed route and paratransit/shared ride service.

• **Fixed Route:** The York bus system is made up of nearly 20 routes serving the City of York and its surrounding suburbs. Route 16 provides regular fixed route service between downtown York and Hanover, and passes between Thomasville and Spring Grove using Route 116. Catch the bus in Thomasville at the Post Office! One-way cash fare is \$1.60, and \$42 unlimited ride monthly passes are available – currently less than the average price of a tank of gas.

• Shared Ride/Paratransit: Do you or someone you know need transportation assistance getting to a medical appointment, job or other life sustaining service? Shared Ride service may be right for you! Unlike a scheduled bus route that only operates along a specific route, Shared Ride (a.k.a. Paratransit) provides consolidated trips between travel origins and destinations during limited hours and specific areas. If Shared Ride sounds like a fit for you, the first step is to submit an application. Conveniently apply online by visiting www.rabbittransit.org > Shared Ride > How to apply.

All Shared Ride trips require a reservation. If you would like same-day service, you must make your reservation by 1:30 p.m. Otherwise, reservations must be made no later than 12:00 p.m. the business day before your ride. Reservations may be made two weeks in advance. For trips on Saturday, Sunday or Monday, reservations must be submitted by 12 p.m. the Friday before. Reservations may be made by calling rabbittransit Customer Service at 1-800-632-9063, or by visiting www.FindMyRidePA.org.

Keep in mind: Shared Ride isn't a "taxi," meaning it isn't a non-stop ride for any one person. Different riders are grouped together depending on their travel time and location(s). Medical trips and/or appointments are given priority over trips for recreational purposes.


